4H Dog Project

What I need for Class Checklist.

Shoes that Cover Toes and Heels of your Foot NO FLIP FLOPS OR
CROCS OR SANDELS. If your instructor can see your heels or toes, you don't
train, and you don't get credit for class.
Six (6') Foot Leash - Leather or Cotton is easiest on the hands and not
as likely as nylon to cause a rope burn if pulled through the hands quickly. You can
wear gloves for training if needed.
A flat Buckle Collar (not the snap buckle type as these have on occasion
broken), a correction collar, or Halti / Gentle Leader. Please Note that the Halti
and Gentle Leader are allowed in class for the beginning of training, They are
NOT allowed in compition (fair) as of yet and you will need to go to a buckle
collar or correction collar to show at the fair. Prong collars are NOT allowed
unless your instructor suggest one and shows you how to use it Correctly and
again these are not allowed int the competition (fair) show ring. All training
collars should be free of tags as tags on collars are also not allowed in the show
ring and are distracting while training. A separate training collar that your dog
only wears during training and obedience workouts are a good idea. Your dog
will learn the difference between the collar He/She wears all the time and the one
they wear for training.
Clean Up Bags – Yes you will need to clean up after your dog. Our
sites are generous enough to allow us to train at them but we are expected to keep
them Clean. We don't want to loose a site do to no one cleaning up after their pet.
By Cleaning it also shows that your are a Responsible Pet Owner.
Water for you AND your Dog. I like to use an ice cream bucker with a
lid. You can fill the pail partially with water and freeze it. On day of training ad
more water to the bucket and the melting ice will help keep your dog's water cool.
Your Dogor a Borrowed one.
This one is not necessary, but when you have shots done for your dog.

have your vet print an extra copy that you can take with when you are traveling with your pet. In case of emergency while on the road this can come in handy if

you have it in the glove box of your car/truck that your dog ride with you. You should have already turned in in a *copy* of your shot records into your project leader along with your class release form. If you haven't Please do so.
